GODHAMBA ROTI

Ingredients:

500 grams of self-raising flour 2 cups of coconut oil A pinch of salt Enough water to make a dough



Method:

Mix flour, salt and enough water to make a non-sticky dough. Make small balls the size of table tennis balls. Pour the oil into a flat but deep bowl. Dip all the tiny balls dipped in this oil overnight and store well covered.

Flatten them as much as possible and fry over a pre-heated frying pan. Add some oil to the pan to avoid burning. It may not take more than one minute for each Godhamba.

Serve with chicken or mutton curry.
