



# A tried and true favourite recipe of one of our famous cooks -

## **Chicken Curry**

~ Doreen Fernando

1 kg chicken drumsticks

1 teaspoon pepper powder

1 teaspoon of turmeric powder

2 table spoons soya sauce

4 table spoons of vinegar

2 teaspoons of curry powder

2 teaspoon of paprika

1 teaspoon of chilly powder

1 teaspoon of crushed ginger

1 teaspoon of crushed garlic

1 whole diced onion

1 sprig of curry leaves

1 table spoon of tomato paste

### Method:

Take the skin off the chicken drumsticks wash and marinate with the pepper, turmeric, soya sauce and vinegar for at least an hour. Heat about two table spoons of oil in a pan and add the onions, curry leaves, ginger and garlic then put the marinated chicken in with the chilly powder, paprika, curry powder and the tomato paste add sufficient water and let simmer until chicken is cooked and the required gravy is obtained. Add salt to taste if necessary.
