From the Kitchen.....

G-Rotti Parcels



(Godhamba Rotti) Serve with curries, Makes 14

NOTE: Dough balls need to sit in oil for at least 4 hours

DOUGH:

- 1. Mix the flour, salt and water in a mixing bowl, and knead until smooth and elastic. Then form golf ball-sized dough balls.
- 2. Pour the oil into a deep bowl and drop the dough balls into it. Set aside for at least 4 hours.

FILLING:

- 1. Heat the oil. Add the onion and garlic and cook for 1-2 minutes.
- 2. Add the vegetables. Then add the curry powder and salt to taste.
- 3. Cook until the vegetables are tender. Set aside.

G-ROTTI PARCELS:

- 1. On a plate, flatten a dough ball into a square or circular shape. Spoon a tablespoon of the filling onto the centre.
- 2. To seal the filling, carefully fold over each corner or edge of the square or circle as though you were wrapping a little parcel.
- 3. Heat a large frying pan and on gentle heat, cook the parcels turning them over to ensure the dough is cooked through and the rottis do not burn.
- 4. Repeat the steps until all the dough balls are used up. Serve warm with curries.

This recipe is from the "Mixing Cultures" Cookbook by Vivienne Abeywardena

DOUGH:

<mark>500 g /</mark> 1 lb plain flour 500 ml / 2 cups vegetable oil 250 ml / 1 cup water <mark>Sea salt</mark>

FILLING:

1 tomato, chopped 2 carrots grated 1 medium onion, chopped 1 potato chopped 125g/4 oz cabbage, thinly sliced 1/2 tablespoon roasted Sri Lankan curry powder 2 tablespoons vegetable oil 2 cloves garlic, crushed 4 small sprigs coriander (cilantro), chopped 1/4 teaspoon chilli powder (optional) 1 sprig curry leaves Pinch of sea salt



The Inez Andrée Benevolent Trust


The Inez Andrée Benevolent Trust is a Brisbane based charity established in memory of Inez Andrée, who passed away in July 2008.
