




**RULE: Non-attendance at Events after** tickets have been sold

Hi everyone,

It's hard to believe that we are already into June. 2021 is moving fast and the committee and I have had our hands full with so many challenges with our 50<sup>th</sup> Jubilee Dance. Countless hours have been spent visiting our venue, negotiating the best package we possibly can, and making hundreds of other decisions in preparation for the Dance.

As mentioned in my last report, plans to hold our function at the Grand Chancellor Hotel in June were scuttled by the weight of member feedback voicing concerns about our choice of venue. By extension, our members' concerns effectively ruled out many other hotels which have a quarantine wing to their business. So it was back to the drawing board and urgently too as we scrambled to find an alternative.

You will probably know by now that we have booked and confirmed the Ballroom at Victoria Park Golf Club on Saturday 28<sup>th</sup> August for our Dance. After all the feedback we've been receiving from our members, we thought we would be fortunate to have 150 guests at the function and budgeted for a worst, most likely and best case scenario of 120, 150 and 170 guests respectively. To our absolute surprise, we received over 300 requests for tickets from members and their guests!! We immediately set up another visit to Victoria Park and after a lot of discussion, established that we can fit a maximum of 240 guests. So once again, we had to re-visit everything including a possible change to their Marquee which holds 350+ guests, but unfortunately it was already booked on the same day. We even considered a possible date change yet again, to try and fit everyone in. After many long hours of deliberation, the Committee made the following key decisions:

- To stick with the Ballroom (with 240 people) and NOT change the date.
- To give ALL members who had booked a guaranteed ticket, and put everyone else (ie. all non-member friends of members) on a waiting list.
- To put some very strict rules around paying for tickets early so that we can quickly establish what extra tickets are available to offer to people on the waiting list.

I'm sorry we'll be unable to have all the friends of all members at our function, but I assure you that we have done the best we can and more, and been extremely fair and diligent in our decision making, all things considered. Believe me, it's been a very challenging time for us but we have stepped up to the plate and made the hard decisions that you expect of us. You should be very proud of your Committee, as I am.

On a related matter, one of the commitments I made to you as President was full transparency of how we operate. In keeping with this promise, I need to tell you that budgeting on having 150-170 guests, and to keep the tickets as affordable as possible, we decided to subsidise the tickets prices as much as possible. The problem is that with a full house of 240 people, we are now well overspent in what we budgeted to subsidise. In other words, the more people we have attending the function, the more we are losing. It would've been much more financially astute to set a cut off at our budgeted 150 or 170 guests to maintain our fiscal responsibilities, but made the tough decision to go well over budget to ensure every possible member of the Club had the opportunity to come celebrate this 'once-in-50-year' event.

We'll have to be very diligent in the coming year or two to re-coup some of our overspending and replenish our reserves. In the meantime, if you could help us with any donations or gifts for the raffle, or with some adverting in our souvenir, please talk to any of the Committee members. It all helps.

In other news, I want to let you know that we have been doing some work with the Federation of Sri Lankan Organisations in Queensland (FSOQ) in recent weeks. For those that don't know about FSOQ, there is an article in this Newsletter written by Marcelle Moran with more detail about FSOQ and the important work it does for all Sri Lankan clubs and indeed to help all Sri Lankans in both Brisbane and 'back home'. At present, I want to promote a special 'buy-a-bed' campaign being supported by all Sri Lankan Clubs, under guidance from FSOQ. Essentially we need funds to send 350 much-needed hospital beds donated by the Mater Hospital to the Sri Lankan hospitals facing massive overcrowding due to Covid-19. Please see the flyer in this Newsletter about this campaign, and please give generously to this worthy cause.

We had our first Have-a-Chat for the year on 16<sup>th</sup> May and once again, it was a great way to spend a Sunday afternoon with some great food from Thilani Caterers, great music from Ray Anthonisz and all the fun of two rounds of bingo. Our Club Captain Sandun Wickramasinghe has written a separate report on the function later in this Newsletter. Our plans for 'Christmas in July' are in full swing and we hope to have a great turnout so please book tickets early to ensure you don't miss out. And just for something a bit different, we are also planning a bus trip to Sirromet Winery at Mount Cotton in June. More information about these two events can also be found in this Newsletter.

That's about all for now. Keep well and stay safe everyone. All the best.



#### (RE) INTRODUCING THE 'FSOQ'

As Laurensz mentioned in his President's Report, we have been doing some work with the Federation of Sri Lankan Organisations in Queensland (FSOQ) in recent weeks. By way of background for those not aware of FSOQ, it was formed in 2013 to ensure a combined 'QLD' voice when engaging with the Australian and Sri Lankan Governments to better the lives of people in Sri Lanka and abroad. The Silver Fawn Club was a founder member of FSOQ and under the leadership of our then President, Davenal Flanderka, made a large contribution to FSOQ's establishment and growth, especially in those formative years. Today, FSOQ's membership comprises eight QLD-based Sri Lankan clubs providing a great diversity of views, goals and aspirations.

Here are just some of FSOQ's achievements, with the assistance of its member clubs:

- Over 3,000 beds distributed to hospitals throughout Sri Lanka through partnering with the SL Ministry of Health and Rotary Jindalee.
- New and second-hand cricket gear sent to the Foundation of Goodness (FOG), a project partnered by the Brookfield Cricket Club.
- Used computers/laptops distributed throughout Sri Lanka.
- Subsequent to the bomb blast in 2019, provided assistance in the form of food packages and recovery assistance to families.
- Schoolbags with essential school supplies provided to students.

Currently, FSOQ is collaborating with its member clubs on a few interesting projects:


- Raising funds to transport another 350 nearly-new electric beds donated by mater hospitals to Sri Lanka. With increasing numbers of COVID-19 patients, Sri Lankan ICU Wards are facing an island wide severe shortage of beds. Please see separate flyer in the Newsletter on how you can donate to this fund-raising.
- Representing the Sri Lankan community in discussions with the Department of Home Affairs regarding the impact of COVID-19 in Sri Lanka, and its likely bearing on the local Queensland community.
- Lodging a request with the Brisbane City Council to lease premises for use by the Sri Lankan Associations in Queensland. The Council encourages community development by providing community organisations with facilities and other resources to deliver their activities, and FSOQ intends to leverage this Council initiative to provide a 'home' for its members associations to have their community work conducted in the premises.
- Forming a sub-committee (including our President) to work on the challenging and highly sensitive issue of Domestic Violence, the objective being to provide information, support and counselling to anyone who has experienced or is at risk of family and domestic violence and/or sexual assault. As a first stage, the sub-committee will develop the information for a web page which can be loaded onto all member clubs' websites. Watch this space.
