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From the Treasurer.....

A note from the Treasurer to inform members that the Club now has an Eftpos machine which accepts Visa and Mastercard debit and credit cards.

The Club's Eftpos facility can be used to make payments such as entry fees for events and subscriptions and will only be available at the event venues. The Club is unable to take credit card payments over the phone and encourages members to make payments for events and subscriptions electronically, wherever possible, direct into its bank account. The use of Visa and Mastercard debit and credit cards attracts a fee charged by the bank which the club will pass onto payers by adding a 2% surcharge to the value of each transaction.

Thank you to our members who have transferred funds electronically to the Club's bank account to pay for tickets prior to events as it makes it much easier to account for and administer the monies received. Please note that cash will still be accepted at venues.



IMPORTANT! PLEASE READ

Please note ruling about non-attendance at our Dances and Have-a-Chat parties.

RULE: Non-attendance at Events after tickets have been sold

- If a member or guest having booked a place at an event and cannot attend due to unforeseen circumstances and does not notify the Club organiser, or cancels their attendance, less than 48 hours **before the function date**, the member or guest, must pay the full price of the Entrance fee (ticket fee).
- If a member or guest having booked a place at an event and cannot attend and informs the Club event organiser atleast 48 hours before the Function date, the Club will refund the Entrance fee (Ticket fee) less the cost of the food as per the Caterer's charge.



Hi everyone,

By the time you are reading this, we will be just 2-3 weeks from our big 50th Jubilee Dance at Victoria Park on 28th August. Every Committee member and the wider Dance Committee, ably led by Gerard Fernando (and including three other former presidents) have spent countless hours working on the function, and I want to start this report by thanking them for their patience, resilience and most importantly, for always keeping the members interests at the heart of our decisions and actions. I'm very proud to say that we have not shirked any challenge especially when it came to those hard decisions about the number of guests we could accommodate. As a result, I can confidently say that every member who wanted to be at the function has been offered a ticket. And with all the planning and preparation that has gone into the function, its gonna' be a really special and memorable evening.

This said, at time of writing this report, QLD has just been put into a hard 3-day lockdown which I'm sure will have made some members nervous about what may happen to our Dance. I hope by the time you receive this Newsletter, things will have settled down in Brisbane. All we can do is stay positive and hope for the best, folks. After everything we have all gone through in the last 12-18 months in particular, we really deserve the chance to properly celebrate this once-in-50-year event.

In my last report, I signalled that as a Club, we'll have to diligently work towards re-cooping some of the Club's reserves we've spent on heavily subsidising the 50th Anniversary Dance tickets. The subsidy allowed us to 'give back' to the members by keeping ticket prices much lower than the cost per head. To this end, the Committee has already started work on our next function after the 50th Dance.

As you will see in the enclosed flyer, we are planning a Fundraising event which will entail a combined Lunch and Food Fair, in the third weekend in September. Rather than pay for a caterer, the Committee will, just this time (and like the old days!), be cooking the simple lunch of string hoppers, to help us raise as much funds as possible. We also hope that the Food Fair will also boost our fundraising on the day. Please note that (as mentioned in the enclosed Flyer), only members/guests who attend the String hopper Luncheon will be able to buy at the Food Fair. In other words, the food fair will only be open to members/guests attending the Luncheon, the idea being that you'll come have lunch and a game or two of bingo with us, and while there, perhaps buy some food to take home and enjoy later.

You will also see a flyer for a bus-trip to the Carnival of Flowers in Toowoomba on the second Friday in September. My thanks to Suzie Anthonisz who has done all the legwork to organise this, including finding a Sri Lankan person to give us an (optional) rice and curry lunch. The main point here is that we have limited number of seats on the bus so early booking is essential please. It should be a fun trip and all the details you need are in the flyer in this Newsletter.

In other news, our recent "Christmas in July" was yet another successful function and I always find myself thinking what a lovely way it is to spend a Sunday afternoon. This time round, we had approximately 80 people, some nice food, music, fun activities, the usual games of bingo etc and I'm sure a good time was had by all. Pleasingly, we were financially diligent and ensured that function costs were more than covered by the entry ticket prices and raffles. More about the function in Denis' report later in this Newsletter.

Before I finish, a quick update about the FSOQ's recent fundraiser to transport those beds to Sri Lanka. In short, the response to the fundraiser was nothing short of spectacular. We needed to raise about \$20,000 but at last report, FSOQ had received about \$44,000 (and counting) due mainly to the amazing generosity of the Sri Lankan community in Brisbane. A big thank you to all who contributed; the extra funds gives us a big advantage whenever other beds become available, because we have funds to pay the costs rather than needing to fundraise for every shipment.

BUS TRIP TO THE CARNIVAL OF FLOWERS



A bus trip to the Carnival of Flowers in Toowoomba has been planned for Friday, 10 September 2021. The bus will leave the Aspley Hypermarket at 8.00am, with a planned stop at Jindalee Home Base to pick up passengers. We should return to Brisbane by 6.00pm.

In Toowoomba, we hope to see Queens Park Botanic Gardens, Laurel Banks Park and the Japanese Gardens and will also make a stop at Spring Bluff Station on our return journey if time permits.




MY JOB JEARCH
