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President's message

Greetings members,

On Wednesday, 7th September, we found ourselves attending a memorial service for Fiona Van Der Poorten, the youngest daughter of dear Betty and Hals, just two months after the devastating loss of their second daughter Nicky. What can one say about such a tragedy that befalls one family in one lifetime, and the helplessness we all feel at their loss. We listened and admired the courage with which Betty, Hals, Fiona's five sons and other loved ones talked about the beautiful tapestry that was her life, truly a life that was well lived but far, far too short. Her love of language, the extremes of her interests, in animals, travel, painting, writing, palm reading, food, philosophy, and so much more; and most importantly her family and her amazing five boys, was so, so inspiring. Fiona herself made a poignant comment on her Facebook page just a day before she passed away; "The glasses are clinking in heaven now because I'm on my way. Thank you and God bless all of you".

Betty and Hals, our hearts ache for your loss and we hope you hear the words we cannot speak, for no words can do justice to the heartache you endure. We cannot begin to understand or take away your grief but we can and will surround you with all the love and support we can muster. We love you very much and send you our deep condolences, blessings and prayers.

Our much-awaited Gala Dance started out so well but for inexplicable reasons stumbled when it came to the food, and resulted in many complaints calls, comments and emails from attendees. Up-front, we agree with you that the quantity and quality of the meal was way below what we expected on the day. Unfortunately, in a commercial arrangement like this, we have no control over how their kitchen works. But as simply as I can put it, we were very badly let down by Figs on Sylvan when it came to the food, after being promised so much. We were also quite surprised at the negative and uncooperative way the event staff dealt with the issues we had towards the end of the night.

Still, as the leader of our Committee, the buck stops with me and I want to apologise unreservedly to all members who attended and their guests for the sub-standard meal that was delivered on the night. I have personally replied to all complaints and I'm happy to discuss this further with anyone as needed.

I would also like, with all due respect, to clarify a few points based on some of the comments we have received.

This function was never intended to be a replacement for the 50th Anniversary dance of two years ago, so comparisons between the two are fruitless. The major difference (as hopefully you'll recall) is that \$10,000 was contributed by the Club to subsidise the 50th function, which enabled us to subsidise each ticket by \$20 for that event and thus give much greater value.

There was no such subsidy for this function, which was run as a normal club event, on a break-even basis like we do for all other club functions.

Regarding buffets, post-Covid, the days of guests serving themselves seem to be over. Most caterers now operate under their view of the prevailing health/hygiene rules regardless of what we think, and have staff serve guests at the buffet. We don't have the luxury of hiring caterers on condition that they allow guests to serve themselves.

Sadly, some comments and feedback we've been on the receiving end of, were quite disheartening and showed no understanding on how disappointed we ourselves are, given everything we did to try and make it a memorable night for our beloved club. Thankfully we've also had a few wonderful messages of support and empathy.

I appeal to you to please remember that we are just a bunch of 12 volunteers who gladly give our time and energy to provide our fellow members with opportunities to meet and have a good time. We do it out of a sense of community and we do the best we can. By all means, give us your feedback when we don't meet your expectations, but please try and be balanced and supportive in your comments. For example, you could add your weight of numbers to the committee's complaints to Figs by contacting them yourself to register your dissatisfaction, as one member has already done. Better still, leave a review about your experience on their function website or Google. It shows them your support for us.

Anyway, as mentioned upfront, the Committee agrees with all comments about the meal and want to assure you we are listening to your feedback. We have looked at what we can do to compensate you for a less than perfect Gala Dance. I'm pleased to announce that we will be subsidising all tickets (members and guests) to the New Year's Eve Dance by \$15 per head and this is reflected in the ticket prices shown on the Flyer in this Newsletter. We welcome and encourage all our members, especially those who attended the Dance, to contact any guests you brought and tell them that we want to make it up to them by putting a group together for New Year's Eve. We hope you will take us up on our offer and give us the opportunity to put things right as best as we can.

To summarise, yes, the meal was a major setback and disappointment but despite this, there was a lot to like about the night. The décor, ambience and music were great and we were also very happy with the way the evening ran, the speeches, the acknowledgement of everyone who has contributed to the Club, the historical vignette, the Souvenir, the raffle, and so many other bits and pieces which took a huge effort from the Committee. Personally, I am very proud of them all as I know we did our very best, but understand that we still fell short in 1-2 areas, especially with the food. It's a learning exercise for us all.

In other news, the Committee hardly had time to draw breath after the Dance as it was all hands on deck to prepare for the Sri Lanka Day and Food Fair organised by the FSOQ on 11th September. All the Sri Lankan Clubs participated with food stalls which shared the preparation and sale of the full range of Sri Lankan cuisine. We sold string-hopper meals plus some short eats and Iced Coffee on the day, and it was another wonderful team effort to prepare and sell the food all day. Needless to say, the day was a resounding success for the Sri Lankan community and for us, it was an exhausting but enjoyable experience, and we raised a bit of money for our Club. A short report on the day is in the Newsletter.

The end of the year is charging towards us, and the Committee has now turned its attention to the remaining few functions for the year. First up is our Bollywood Night, on Saturday 29th October. As always, we have a few little fun surprises planned for the night, a buffet Indian meal being prepared by Con from My Catering Club, and Bollywood and Boogie music by DJ Russell Lowe. Please see the flyer for more information.

You will also find a flyer in this Newsletter about our Christmas Party, scheduled for Saturday evening 3rd December (please put this date in your diary before your Christmas weekends fill up!) and the New Year's Eve Dance. Thilani will be returning to provide the catering for both these events and we hope you will all join us at Christmas and New Year to complete another year of good times for the club.

Finally, my apologies that this Newsletter is getting out to you a little late this time. The last few weeks have been very busy for the Committee with the Gala Dance and the FSOQ Sri Lanka Day Food Fair coming along in successive weekends which really stretched our time and resources.

That's about all for now. Keep well, stay safe and be kind to each other, and please keep Hals, Betty and the Van Der Poortens in your thoughts and prayers.

And finally.... Our fiftieth anniversary celebration came to fruition on our third attempt....and in our 52nd year.



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
