## On the Couch with ...... Gerard Fernando

#### Bio

#### Do you have a hero?

Gerard admires the Queen who devoted her life to service. "No-one has a bad word to say about her."

#### If you had a magic wand how would you change the world?

Gerard said he'd like to go back to the good life of the seventies when "the world was a younger and more innocent place."


