President's message

Dear Members,

There were some items we needed to buy and re-sell but it was still a lot of preparation and a long hot day in the park, and I want to specially thank the committee members for the work everyone put into the day. A big thank you also to Suzie, Namal and Ranjan, Ray and Heather, and Tami Dissanayake who donated many of the items we sold on the day.

Unfortunately, our stall was not that well patronised on the day but overall, the whole event was well organised by the FSOQ, with a superb cultural show and a demonstration across the park of everything Sri Lanka. And based on what I heard from the politicians and dignitaries' speeches (including from our Lord Mayor), they fully support the vision of establishing a "Sri Lanka" day in Brisbane (much like the Greeks, Italians, and other ethnic groups have achieved), and I can see the event continuing to establish itself in the coming years.

Our next event was our Melbourne Cup Luncheon and we had planned lots of fun, food and games centred around this iconic horse race. It had been a while since we had one of those fun Have-a-Chat afternoons but unfortunately (and somewhat surprisingly), we didn't even come close to getting the numbers needed. So there was no choice but to cancel the event to minimise any financial impact. Naturally, it is disheartening, but all we can do is put it behind us and move forward.

Our Christmas function is only about 3-4 weeks away and our New Year's Eve Dance about 4 weeks later. For Christmas, Ruwan from Negombo Caterers returns to provide us with a delicious Christmas menu while music for dancing will be shared by Ray Anthonisz and Arden Foster; I'm thinking of joining them for a few songs sometime during the night. For New Year, Thilani returns with her usual feast which'll include Kiribath at midnight. Cool Daddies will be our band once again for the night, with DJ Russell Lowe bringing his usual high energy music to usher in the new year. As I reflect on 2023 from a club perspective, the big challenge for our committee this year has been trying to 'read' what exactly members are seeking from their club in terms of functions. Also, only a handful of members visited our stall at the Sri Lanka Day.


On behalf of all of us on the Committee, can I ask everyone to please take a minute to consider what type of event(s) you are likely to patronise, and drop us a note with your thoughts.


