Update from the Treasurer

As you would know, we received funds from the QLD Govt's Gambling Community Benefit Fund to help us refresh most of our old archaic club assets which have long been written off. Here again, are the five areas where we have received funding:

PA System – Amp, Microphones, Mixer, Mic Stands, Leads	\$6,114		
Projector and Screen	\$4,908		
Laptops x 2 plus Microsoft Office, Security and Accounting packages	\$5,086		
Website Development	\$6,600		
Club Banners	\$800		
TOTAL GRANT FUNDS	\$23,508		

By way of an update:

- We have now purchased all the above items.
- Work is continuing on the development of the website with the funds we received.
- As we have some funds remaining after purchase of the above items, we have applied to the Queensland Government's Grant managers for a 'variation' to spend some of these savings on a good quality printer for the Club and some cases for the new equipment we purchased. It'll be a real bonus if we can get this approved.

We are required to 'acquit' the funds by 30th November (we got approval for an extension) and I expect that we will be returning about \$1,000 - \$1,500 of unspent Grant funds to the QLD Govt once we have purchased all the approved items. I will continue to keep you updated on our Grant spending.

In other news, here are the financial results from the last three functions/events since our last Newsletter:

- Christmas-in-July Excess of Income over Expenses (Profit) of \$608
- Anniversary Dance 2024 Excess of Income over Expenses (Profit) of \$383
- FSOQ SRI Lanka Day Excess of Expenses over Income (Loss) \$204
