We are all set for a night of good food and toe tapping dancing to celebrate our 55th Anniversary at the Grand Chancellor Hotel on 27th September!




Held on 20 August 2025 in the Premier's and Speaker's Hall at Parliament House, the event brought together leaders from a wide range of multicultural communities.
